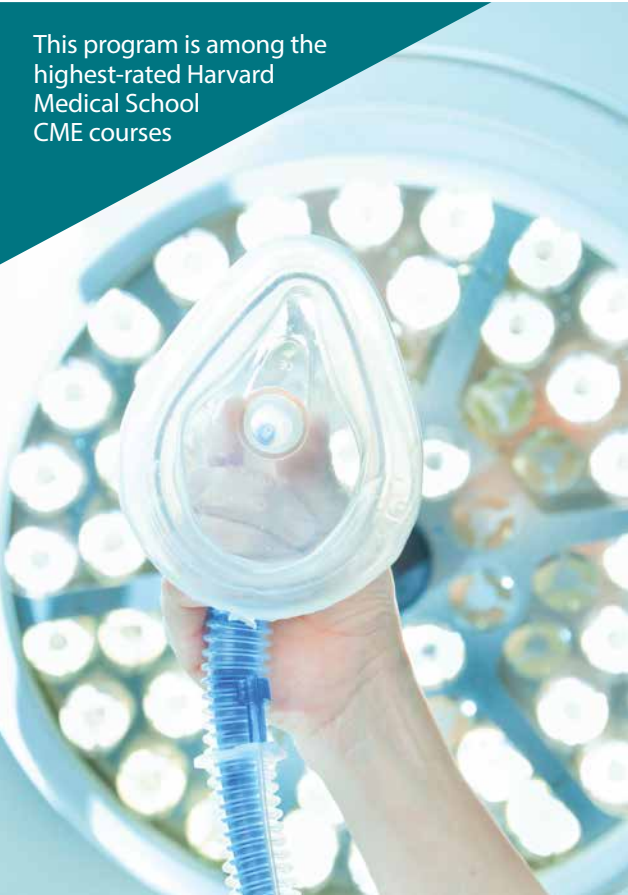

Anesthesiology Update 2019

Course Description

This in-depth course, sponsored by the Harvard Medical School Departments of Anesthesia and Continuing Education, is intended to provide anesthesia practitioners with a comprehensive review of the most important advances in clinical anesthesiology and each of its major subspecialties, including ambulatory, thoracic, pediatric, obstetric, regional, and cardiac anesthesia.
